

11. Medical Council of India has recommended 15 days practical training for MBBS students in FWT department for gaining practical knowledge of Post Mortem Examination. This recommendation of the M.C.I shall be implemented forthwith. This training shall form a part of the Housemanship training meant for MBBS passouts.

Likewise one week training programme for the Health Staff who are involved in Post Mortem Examination work shall be organized by the CDMOs at the district level.

12. Health & F.W. Department shall issue a clear cut circular to all the CDMOs indicating the steps to be followed by the Medical Officers while conducting Post Mortem Examination.

13. Home Department shall issue a clear cut circular to all the Superintendents of Police indicating that the steps should be followed by the Police Officers while sending deadbodies for post Mortem Examination.

14. Standard Text Books on Forensic Medicine and Toxicology are often not available for reference by doctors while conducting Post Mortem Examination. At least one copy of a Standard Text Book on Forensic Medicine and Toxicology shall be supplied to each CDMO, District Headquarters Hospital, Sub-Divisional Hospitals and every Post Mortem Centre.
